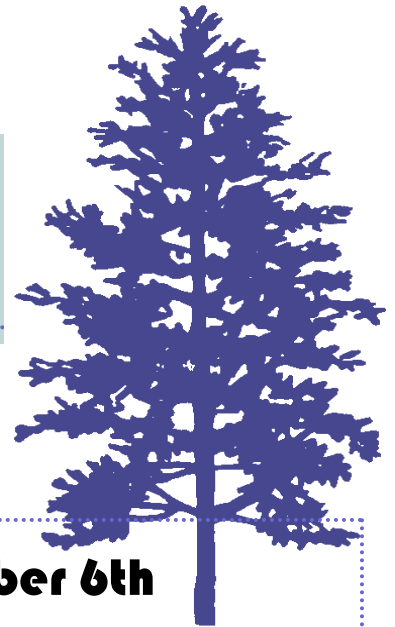

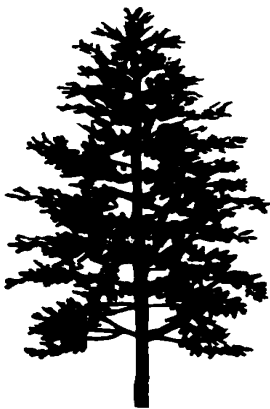

THERE IS WISDOM AND THERE IS WISDOM

Ted was a boy scout and more brilliant than most 40 year olds at the age of 10. At the age of 12 he composed music and studied his favorite composers were Bach and Gabrielli. The University of Chicago gave him a scholarship to study Greek Tragedies at 15. He was 16 when he was accepted at Harvard and completed four years of undergraduate education in three years. Three years later he had completed a Masters and Ph.D. in Mathematic at the top graduate programs in the world, the University of Michigan. His dissertation received the prize as the top mathematical research discovery in the world the year he accepted an invitation to join the faculty at the University of California—Berkeley. He was brilliant but he was also broken. His name Ted Kaczynski....You may also know him as the UNABOMBER. He currently serves a life sentence without parole at the top maximum security prison in the United States in Colorado....In this time of year when many prepare to return to school, we should never forget that while education is good, it is not the ultimate ticket to greatness or success. There is a reason the wise man said," Wisdom is better than being foolish, but what is gained for both the wise and fool die...Here is the end of the matter: Fear God and keep his commandments, this is what really matters. (Eccl. 2:13 and 12:12, 13)."
